Location

Renowned as a secluded seaside resort of the rich and famous, the town of Opatija is situated to the west of the city of Rijeka on the Adriatic coast. Opatija means “abbey” in Croatian, and the town is named after an abbey that was established by Benedictine monks in the 14th century of which its centre-point, St James’s Church, still stands.

The town of Opatija developed as an elite holiday resort in the mid-19th Century, and

was frequented by European kings and emperors of the Austro-Hungarian monarchy. Tourism in this area has thrived and Opatija is still a popular location today, especially for European tourists. In the summer months, Opatija is a well-known setting for culture and the arts, hosting concerts, theatrical performances, film, literature and multimedia events.

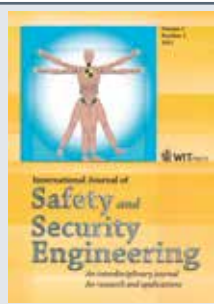
